## Content Evaluation Guidelines: Evaluation of Eligibility

### Master of Arts in Teaching English Education (Secondary)

A transcript evaluation is completed once official transcripts from all previously attended institutions have been received by WGU. Please note that transcripts must be sent to WGU directly from the issuing institution to be considered official. WGU does not perform unofficial evaluations or accept unofficial transcripts. The guidelines below will provide a good indication of the content area requirements needed for admission into the Master of Arts in Teaching program. Transcripts must be received prior to your initial term start date.

To be eligible to begin the Master of Arts in Teaching program, you must meet all the requirements listed below.

#### COURSES ACCEPTED:

- Must be college level from a regionally accredited institution in the United States.
- Students must present a grade point average of 2.0 (C) on all coursework submitted (**WGU TX requires a grade point average of 2.5 or better.**)
- May not be used to fulfill more than one course of study.
- Must meet the competency unit and content equivalency requirements.
- Course may not be at the Freshman level.
- Prerequisites must total at least 32 units. **15 units must be at the Junior or Senior level. No Freshman level courses may be used.**

<i>Language and Communication</i>	
AREA	CONTENT REQUIREMENT
Language and Communication: Linguistics	One course in Introduction to the English Language or Linguistics (covering morphology, syntax, phonetics, and semantics), equivalent to 3 units.
Language and Communication: Writing	Two courses in Introduction to Writing, Creative Writing or Expository Writing, excluding Business Communication, equivalent to 6 units.
Language and Communication: Presentation	One course in general speech, including Public Speaking, excluding Business Communication, equivalent to 3 units.

<i>Cultural Studies</i>	
AREA	CONTENT REQUIREMENT
Cultural Studies	One course in Cultural Studies, Introduction to Diversity or Multicultural studies, equivalent to 3 units.

<i>Literature Studies</i>	
AREA	CONTENT REQUIREMENT
Literature Studies	Three courses in American Literature, World Literature, British Literature, or Multicultural Literature, equivalent to 9 units.

<i>Additional English and Literature Studies</i>	
AREA	CONTENT REQUIREMENT
Grammar	One course, equivalent to 3 units, in grammar.
Reading	One course, equivalent to 3 units, in reading.

General Survey of Literature	One course, equivalent to 3 units, in a general survey of literature.
Journalism	One course, equivalent to 3 units, in journalism
Additional English Requirement	One course, equivalent to 3 units, in upper division English, including literature, reading, writing, dramatic, or theatrical arts.
